From Mrs. Appell . . .

Seniors, your college lists should be finalized! Stay on track with your grades and extracurricular activities. Make sure you have taken the ACT/SAT enough times to get your scores as high as you possibly can. Be sure to watch deadlines, especially ones dated January 1st since we do not return to school until January 6th from Christmas break. Continue to look for scholarships (you have been given multiple websites to search) and apply to the NCAA if you want to play Division I, II sports.

Juniors, stay on track with your grades and classes - it is never too late to improve! As soon as the PSAT results are back, take the time to review it and look at the ones you missed. Begin to evaluate your post-high school education options (4 year college, 2 year college,

vocational/technical, or military). Start a list of colleges that include both your "dream" schools and "safer" schools that you know you could get accepted to. Begin taking the ACT/SAT. If you are planning on playing Division I, II sports, start the NCAA application process. Your extracurricular activities play an important role on your college applications so consider taking on some leadership roles. Set up college visits and begin to learn about financial aid (CFWV.com).

Sophomores, you were able to take both the PSAT and PLAN tests this year, so when the results are back, take the time to review the answers. Stay on track with your grades. Begin learning about the college admission process and explore potential careers.

Practice writing and read, read, read! Visit Collegeboard.com to help you look for colleges that may be right for you. Get a summer job or volunteer at a nonprofit organization. Build relationships with your teachers because they will be the ones writing your letters of recommendation. Visit colleges while on break or whenever you are near a campus.

Freshmen, review your PLAN test results when they return. Get involved by joining clubs and organizations, including sports. Explore your interests (CFWV.com, collegeboard.com, Myers-Briggs.com). Start building your credentials.

Catholic Schools Week 2014 ...



During the week of January 26 -February 1, 2014 we will be celebrating Catholic Schools Week! Here is a

tentative schedule of events that we have planned for this year's celebration:

<u>Sunday: Mass</u> - Students are asked to attend 10am Mass at St. Joe in their uniform. Students will start the week with prayer and thanksgiving for the great blessing that have come from attending a Catholic school. Music ministry, servers, gift bearers, Extraordinary Ministers, and readers will all come from the school.

Monday: Student Appreciation Day - Faculty and Staff will provide milk, juice, fruit, and donuts at break as a way of expressing gratitude for our student body. No homework will be given this night and no tests or quizzes will follow on Tuesday.

Tuesday: A Living Rosary - We will construct a rosary from helium balloons and raffia. All students will come to the gym and hold part of the rosary and offer their own intentions of why our Catholic School is important to them and why we are a community of faith, knowledge and service here at St. Joe. Then we pray the entire rosary. Once we have prayed the rosary we will release it outside. This is a symbol of our prayers being lifted up to heaven.

Wednesday: Mass - We will celebrate with our middle school brothers and sisters at 10am. The Mass will be offered for our benefactors and patrons. We will give an account of the number of service hours, service projects, and other Corporal Works of Mercy that our students participate in over the course of the school year.

Thursday: A Day of Prayer - We will begin in the morning with a novena prayer and then continue it at the beginning of each period throughout the day. Each classroom teacher would have copies of the prayer so the students will pray aloud at the beginning of each period. By the end of the day, we will have completed the novena.

Friday: Teacher Appreciation Day - Students have the opportunity to write a quick "thank you" to any of the faculty or staff that have made a positive influence in their lives during their time here at St. Joe. Each teacher will have a bag hanging on the outside of their door where the students can put their thank you cards. Time will be used in Theology classes to write them.
